

**MIFFLIN COUNTY PRISON BOARD MEETING**  
**December 3, 2025**

The Mifflin County Prison Board met on Wednesday, December 3, 2025 at 1:30 p.m. in Meeting Room B on the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor of the Courthouse. Members present were Commissioners Robert Postal and Noah Wise, District Attorney Chris Torquato, Acting Sheriff James Aumiller.

Guests present were Warden Jason Kormanic, Deputy Warden Gates, Prison Board Solicitor Mark Remy, Sheriff Elect Doug Cramer and Fiscal Affairs Assistant Holly Yeager.

Commissioner Kevin Kodish, Treasurer Diane Griffith, and President Judge Gingrich were absent.

The meeting was called to order by Commissioner Postal at 1:30 pm.

**I. Approval of Minutes:**

Motion was made by Commissioner Wise to approve the minutes of the Prison Board Meeting of April 2, 2025. Acting Sheriff Aumiller seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously approved.

**II. Warden's Report:**

**Maintenance:**

- There are no issues at this time.
- County Maintenance replaced several 3-inch water lines in the basement.
- New circulator pumps were installed this week for the HVAC system and the system is operating well overall.

**Incidents:**

- No major issues.

**Treatment Services:**

- All services are up and running.

**Booking:**

- No issues.

**Medical/Mental Health:**

- Blane Baker has been hired as a new part-time LPN
- Beginning January 1, 2026 medical coverage will be extended +½ hour, ending at 9:00 p.m. each day.
- The Medical staff will begin conducting pre-screening for new commitments before the facility formally takes custody of an individual, as long as a nurse is available. At the moment, Booking Officers are handling this process.

**Food Service:**

- No concerns to report. Cost of items are still rising, though the pace has become more manageable.
- The dishwasher's booster heater has been replaced.

- A warming rack has been purchased since the last Prison Board meeting.

**Census/Population Report:**

- Population as of Dec. 2, 2025 - Mifflin – 72; Out of County – 52; Total in house – 124
- To date for 2025, Mifflin average daily population is 85.5 (16.7 females and 68.8 males)
- To date in 2024, Mifflin average daily population was 79.6 (Females 14.5 and 65 males)

**Contracts:**

- Approved at Commissioner’s Meetings since the last Prison Board meeting:
  - CPC (Combined Public Communications) No changes or increases to inmates or their families; however, County commission rates have been increased in selected areas.

- Housing contracts are in place with Centre and Clinton County Correctional Facilities to accommodate Mifflin County inmates should out-of-county placement become necessary.
- A contract for laboratory services with Geisinger Lewistown Hospital will be presented at the next Commissioner's meeting.
- The process to update our housing contract with the United States Marshals Service has been initiated.

**III. Other Business:**

- Title 37 Inspection is scheduled for March 11, 2026
- The Pennsylvania Department of Corrections has implemented a daily per-diem charge of \$81.29 for county inmates transferred to the PA State DOC due to medical or behavioral needs that the county is unable to accommodate.
- MCCF holding individuals for Public Drunkenness under letter/memo from 1997.
  - Commissioner Postal suggested that a meeting should be requested in Chambers to review the 1997 memo.
- Finger Print Order Issues
  - A concern raised by the Court prompted an update to the policy on December 3, 2025. Deputy Warden Gates will send a follow-up email outlining the details of this revision. Moving forward, Warden Kormanik requests that any related concerns be directed to him or Deputy Warden Gates so they can be addressed promptly.
