## Frequently Asked Questions

- Q- When can I visit an inmate?
- A- Upon commitment inmates will be given an Inmate Visitor Selection Form that must be submitted prior to receiving visits. During the Booking process inmates will also select a visit day and time from the available slots for the facility.

(For more information please refer to the Family Information Guide)

- Q- What do I do to keep people in jail from calling me?
- A- If it occurs again, listen to the complete message and there is an option to permanently block all calls from Mifflin County Correctional Facility.
- Q- How many visits do inmates get per week?
- A- Generally inmates receive (1) one hour visit per week. (For more information please refer to the Family Information Guide)
- Q- When will inmate <u>John Doe</u> go to court?
- A- Only the committing authority can answer that question accurately.
- Q- When will inmate \_John Doe\_ go to another facility?
- A- Mifflin County Correctional Facility can not release transport information.
- Q- How can I put money on an inmate's account?
- A- Mifflin County Correctional Facility has a kiosk in the lobby that is available 24-hour/day. It accepts cash and debit cards. Funds can also be added by using the link "Add Funds to an Inmate Account" on the home page of this website
