COMMUNITY NOTICE LETTER

April 7, 2025

Dear Municipal Official:

The Mifflin County Board of Commissioners are pleased to announce the opening of the Federal Fiscal Year 2025 Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program. This program utilizes HUD funds through the Pennsylvania Entitlement Program as enacted by Pennsylvania Act 179. This Act further requires that the County serve as the local administering agency for these funds for all County municipalities with populations of less than 4,000.

For Federal Fiscal Year 2025, Mifflin County is estimated to receive \$222,473. The County will also include in its application CDBG funds estimated at \$93,545 on behalf of Armagh Township; \$94,564 on behalf of Brown Township; \$128,160 on behalf of Derry Township; \$100,167 on behalf of Granville Township; and \$142,975 on behalf of Lewistown Borough. Eligible activities include broad areas of housing, community infrastructure, economic development, and public services. Specific activities may include property acquisition, recreation, and senior facilities. Funds may also be used for public works, water and sewerage development/improvement, and the removal of architectural barriers. All projects must have a direct benefit to low- and moderate-income residents, elimination of slums and blight, and/or elimination of urgent threats to health and safety.

In order to receive input and to solicit proposals, a Public Hearing and Project Development Workshop will be held on May 1, 2025, at 6:00 PM, at the Mifflin County Courthouse. Public hearings pertaining specifically to the OBO municipalities will be held as follows: Armagh Township on May 12, 2025, at 6:00 PM, in the Armagh Township Municipal Building, 283 Broad Street, Milroy; Brown Township on April 21, 2025, at 7:00 PM in the Brown Township Municipal Building, 22 Brown Township Drive; Derry Township on April 21, 2025, at 5:30 PM, in the Derry Township Municipal Building, 73 Reserve Lane, Lewistown; Granville Township on May 5, 2025, at 4:00 PM in the Granville Township Municipal Building, 100 Helen Street, Lewistown; and Lewistown Borough on May 5, 2025, at 4:30 PM, in the Lewistown Borough Building, 2 East Third Street, Lewistown. These meetings will provide information regarding the program and, more important, will assist communities in developing their project requests, including determination of project's eligibility for CDBG funding, and methods to determine if your project serves or provides a benefit to an area that is 51% or more low to moderate income people. Projects intended to eliminate blight, or an urgent health and safety threat do not need to meet this income requirement for consideration of funding.



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Attached to this letter is the application preparation schedule, as well as a project summary form to be completed by applicants. Project information is requested to determine project eligibility, fundability, cost, and schedule to ensure efficient development and construction should the project be selected by the Commissioners. We are requesting a map of the service area, the number of households served, and a list of addresses in the service area. We are also asking applicants to submit an estimate of probable cost and a schedule from an engineer. We will review the form and necessary project information at the workshop on May 1, 2025. If you are unable to attend the hearings, you may complete and submit the project summary form with attachments to Carol Kearney High before April 29, 2025, for Mifflin County; May 7, 2025, for Armagh Township; May 8, 2025, for Brown Township; April 16, 2025, for Derry Township, May 1, 2025, for Granville Township, and May 1, 2025, for Lewistown Borough.

Following the workshop, the Mifflin County Commissioners will accept proposals which will be evaluated based on need, impact, and completeness. Projects will then be prioritized by Mifflin County for submission to DCED. Projects that are submitted with all requested documentation, including the estimate of probable cost, and from applicants who attended the Public Hearing and Project Development Workshop will be prioritized for funding.

We strongly encourage you to attend the Public Hearing and Project Development Workshop. It will provide additional insight into the application process, as well as allow us to review your project in detail. You should contact Carol Kearney High at SEDA-COG to discuss your project before submitting the project summary form.

We are excited about the benefits that this program may yield throughout Mifflin County and look forward to seeing you at the meeting on May 1, 2025.

#### Principal benefit of the project to low to moderate income persons

- 51% of individuals benefiting from the project must be of low to moderate income (ACS Data or survey)
- This Objective is the most often met by projects using CDBG
- 70% of the County's CDBG funds must be used to meet this objective

#### Elimination of slum or blight

- Spot (single structure) or Area, which requires a municipal declaration
- Used occasionally for demolition of deteriorated structures
- Maximum of 30% of County CDBG funds can be used

#### Response to urgent need

- Formal declaration of a disaster or emergency
- Emergency has occurred in the last 18 months
- Can only be used to eliminate the emergency
- Project must not be affordable from the local budget
- Maximum of 30% of County CDBG funds may be used to meet this objective



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


